- A. Describe your error (what were you thinking - how did you make your mistake?) What was the misunderstanding that led you to answer incorrectly?
- B. Write the correct answer with an explanation.
- C. Write a sample problem similar to the one you missed, in the appropriate format, and answer it correctly. Make sure that it is not just restating the original problem.

*Add sheets as needed to show all corrections. Paper clip the original test to those sheets with this cover sheet on top.*

## How to Write a Test Resubmittal

In writing a test resubmittal, your goal is to show me that you have learned from the mistakes that you made on the test and to *prove* to me that you completely understand the concepts now. In order to do this, you need to do four steps for every problem that you are correcting.

First, show that you understand why you made the mistake. What was your misunderstanding at the time? What specifically led you to answer incorrectly?

Second, show that you know the correct answer and provide a complete explanation of *why* the answer is what it is.

Finally, you need to create and answer another question about the same topic that further shows your understanding of the concept in question. Please don't regurgitate the same question, slightly modified. Make up a *new* question that shows some originality.

Technical issues: Your resubmittal should be work processed, double spaced. You should spell check and proof read it carefully before turning it in. It should include diagrams and equations (which should be hand written or drawn) as needed. The resubmittal should also have a cover sheet filled out completely, and the original test. Please don't make corrections on the original test, as that makes it harder to see what the original mistake was. The resubmittal is due within a week of the time you receive the corrected test from me.
